

In this project, you will work in groups of two or three to compose a Latin skit. To ensure that each member contributes an equal amount, you will be graded individually. Groups are expected to work together to come up with a topic and rehearse their skit, but the Latin dialogue will be composed and graded individually.

Students are responsible for composing a dialogue in Latin that consists of at least 100 words. In this dialogue you must incorporate at least **three passive verbs, two comparisons—one using a comparative adjective and quam and another using a comparative adjective and an ablative—two superlative adjectives, and three perfect passive participles.**

The assignment will be due on **Monday, November 25**. On this day, each student will turn in a copy of their Latin dialogue and an English translation. In addition, one person in the group will turn in a complete Latin text and English translation of their skit.

Each group is free to choose any topic or scene they want. The more creative and humorous, the better. While costumes and props are not required, they are encouraged. I will award extra credit points to groups who wish to go above and beyond with the performance of their skit. I encourage everyone to come in and review a draft of their dialogue prior to submitting the assignment. Have fun!
